# **Business Development Statistics** from Lending Activities since inception (1986)

- Federal Government loan portfolio contributions:
  - Traditional Investment Fund = \$2,060,000
  - Regional Relief And Recovery Fund = \$1,357,635
- Loan portfolio value as at March 31, 2024:
  - Traditional Investment Fund = \$2,202,285 (27 Loans)
  - Regional Relief and Recovery Fund = \$415,465 (8 loans)
- Funds available for lending on March 31, 2024 = \$3,484,977
- NSCFDC has advanced \$21,008,773 million to 470 local businesses.

# **Business & Technical Support**



- NSCFDC staff received 133 general inquires and provided 172 referrals.
- Additionally, NSCFDC staff provided 168 in-depth counselling interviews with non-loan clients, and 43 indepth counselling interviews with loan clients.
- > NSCFDC staff also held one workshop.

- Penetanguishene Economic Advisory Committee: NSCFDC Client Care Coordinator is an active member of the Task Force. Their objectives are:
  - Inform businesses of funding available for business improvements
  - Identify priorities to promote business development & retention
  - Provide recommendations for future Town programs & initiatives
  - Assist in the implementation of action items identified in the BR&E study
  - Report findings back to Council periodically or when needed

- 2. Ask an Expert (Webinar Series): The NSCFDC collaborated with Simcoe County business resources & support agencies to put on educational webinars for business owners within the NSCFDC's catchment area.
- 3. Georgian Bay Business Connections (GBBC): The NSCFDC General Manager is an active member

#### **Activities**

**BizLink** (formerly the Business Transition Matching) 4. Program): NSCFDC in collaboration with the Orillia CDC, the Nottawasaga CFDC, and the Centre for Business and Economic Development embarked on a three-year project building on the success of a pilot initiative led by the Orillia CDC, and the Nottawasaga CFDC. The project supports buyers and sellers of businesses within the NSCFDC's catchment area by providing them with tools and coaching so they can make well-informed decisions. Project funding ended in August 2023, It continues to run in steady-state.

- 5. High School Trades Scholarships: NSCFDC provided scholarships to the 4 high schools located within its catchment area (3 English, 1 French). The scholarships are provided to deserving graduates that are going to pursue post secondary education in skilled trades (\$250 per high school).
- 6. Midland Penetanguishene & District Builders' Association (MPDBA): NSCFDC General Manager is an active member of the MPDBA.

- County of Simcoe's Regional Economic Development Network: NSCFDC General Manager is an active participant with the Economic Development Network.
- 8. Simcoe County Agritourism Working Group: The Client Care Coordinator participates in the meetings. Their Objectives:
  - Encourage & strengthen synergies amongst agrotourism stakeholders
  - Identify new & developing agrotourism products & experiences in the region
  - Create an economic impact to the region through agrotourism
